## Life Member – Scott Gibbs

I would like to nominate Scott Gibbs for life membership to the Riverside Cricket Club.

I remember being on a committee that meet with Scott in early 2003 at the Greensborough pub to interview him for our Captain Coach role. Whilst I had played against Scott in the juniors and remembering his dominance as the best junior cricketer for Diamond Creek (and the Valley for that matter!) it was this meeting that left me feeling that this guy was an absolute ripper and the type of person we had to get to our club. I remember him telling us of his loyalty, (at that stage he had only played for Diamond Creek, Northcote and his team in England), and I remember his passion for cricket and his willingness to teach others and lead from the front.

To his credit (and a sign of the type of person Scott was) he informed us that he would like to speak to Diamond Creek as they were his junior club and he wanted to give them a chance to talk to him. Fortunately for us (the Riverside Cricket Club) Scott chose us! From the very beginning Scott was professional and passionate and it was clear from the start that the on field culture of our club was going to change. Our pre seasons, our training sessions, our skills and our game plans were to become better as did our entire playing group.

It's not just our senior club that has benefitted from Scott coming to us, he has now started to shape our juniors as well. With his son Alex starting to play under 12's, Scott has put his hand up to help coach the juniors. Even before that whilst Scott and Kerry lived in Mernda (and whilst Scott had a couple of years at Eltham), Scott continued to have his boys learn to play cricket at Riverside doing Milo and T20 blast with us. In my years as a senior player I can't recall a player / Captain Coach that has had a bigger impact on the senior playing group than Scott. He always knew who did what each week in each grade and made a point of highlighting guy's successes right across the grades.

Scott bleeds green and gold, I don't think any of the 11 that won the Barclay Shield grand final were prouder of their medals than Scott. Some of his post grand final photos have become legendary and I don't think Scott took his medal off for at least 2 weeks straight. Scott loves the Riverside Cricket club. There aren't too many guys who have played in his time at the club that don't have a story about Gibbo, who haven't shared a beer, a coke zero or a laugh with him. Fortunately for us, Scott hasn't finished giving to the Riverside Cricket Club, we are lucky to have him. As at the end of the 2017-18 season

## **Life Member – Robert Hoyne**

I would like to nominate Rob Hoyne for life membership of the Riverside Cricket Club, in recognition of outstanding service to our club over the last 40 years, as player, junior coach, sponsor and supporter.

On the field, Rob was a very good player. Playing 138 games for the club, mainly during the clubs most successful era of the 1980's, he played predominantly in the fourths and fifths, accumulating 2130 runs as a hard hitting middle order batsman, and taking 12 wickets as a very part time, fairly ordinary medium pacer. His top score was 81 and his best bowling was 3/24.

During this time Rob played in 4 premierships sides. 2 in D grade and 2 in E grade.

Rob stopped playing in the early 1990's, but has played some games up until 2011/12 season when he was helping us out with numbers, by "filling in" when we were short in the lower grades.

When Dan commenced playing junior cricket, Rob of course was there, every step of the way, assisting with the management of the teams, coaching, and providing great support to fellow coaches and the junior players. He continues to be heavily involved in the club. Importantly, he is a sponsor of the club, and has been for some years. He continues to attend club functions, and is there week in, week out, supporting our teams from the boundary, (including when Dan isn't playing), and it goes without saying that he will be at the bar at the conclusion of each Saturday.

He continues to be one of our staunchest supporters, and there was no prouder person than Rob when we won the 2017/18 A grade flag, with Dan being a major contributor. His "thank you" sign off when Salmy hit the winning runs was pure gold.

## **Life Member – Liam Money**

Please consider my nomination of Liam Money for Life Membership of the riverside cricket club.

The Money name is heavily etched in the history of Riverside Cricket club and Liam's contribution to the club has continued the work and dedication of those family members before him.

Liam has contributed to the club in both his on field and off field roles. Firstly, to on field, Liam has played over 150 senior games for the club ranging from the 1st Eleven through to the 8th Eleven. In fact, Liam is one of only a handful of players that has played in all grades of the club. Liam's A grade debut was in the 2001 season with cap 184 and would go on to play 27 games in A grade with a highest score of 79 not out.

Over his career he has made over 3,200 runs at an average of 24 which includes 3 hundreds and 15 50's and a highest score of 152 no out.

Bowling wise you could say under used as he has taken 6 wickets at 13.2 from only 15 overs.

During his playing career he captained our thirds for 2 seasons and our seconds for a season.

Liam has won 3 club batting awards and also the Ben Brodie award for the best under 21-year-old in the 2002 season whilst playing A grade.

Liam's off field contribution to the club is an equally impressive. He has served on the committee for 10 years which includes three years as president and 1 year as vice president.

Although no longer on the committee Liam continues to support the club by assisting with the sponsorship program by developing new sponsorship packages and obtaining new sponsors.

Off field, Matt has been a very active volunteer at the club. He has served 6 seasons on the committee on which he is currently a member. He is always willing to help and never complains if asked to do the undesirable jobs. He has also coached our juniors for the past 6 seasons, taking them to two premierships along the way.

There is no doubt that Matt bleeds green and gold and will do anything for this club. ## **COACH'S REPORT**

New arrivals, a number of junior boys coming up from the Under 16's and the returning core proved to make things really exciting as I knew there would be a different challenge again this year. Andy Villani was taking the reigns as the A Grade Captain, Jeff Callaway was appointed as the new batting coach and Tim Knox was identified as the bowling coach. With these changes and the loss of some of our senior leaders, we were really looking toward the playing group to see who would lead by example and step up leading into the season. ## **1<sup>st</sup> XI (DVCA Barclay Shield)**

How do you define success? Is it purely by premierships or is it by player development? Or is it a combination of both? I would like to think that it is a combination of both. Yes, it would have been great to back up our 2017/18 season and go back-to-back but that is very hard to do and very few clubs achieve this. However, what we were able to achieve this season was further player development of not only the A Grade playing group but the entire Riverside playing group, and I see that as a success. We may not have tasted the ultimate success in A Grade or any of the other grades this year but I firmly believe that we will be featuring at the pointy end of the 2019/20 season in many grades due to the opportunity and development that has occurred this season.

Speaking of opportunity, many players got the opportunity to represent the club in grades higher than they would have anticipated at the start of the season. This was due to a combination of hard work and A Grade missing basically five premiership players for the duration of the season. This had a flow-on effect throughout the rest of the grades and enabled players that had been pressing for selection at a higher grade over the past couple of seasons and opportunity. A deserved opportunity to pit themselves against and test themselves against a higher quality opposition, thus further developing their skills. I will get into the specifics later but we had six players make their Barclay Shield debut for the club.

Since the end of the season I have had plenty of time to sit back and reflect. Yes, it was a tough season and things didn't go the way we would have liked. As I previously mentioned, it would have been great to emulate our success from last season but it didn't happen. We simply weren't good enough. Several factors contributed to this and Rozzi and I have taken note of these. We learn and we move on. We don't sit here making excuses and dwell on the negatives. Too often we look at life through a negative lense and fail to see the positives. According to studies we are seven times more likely to find a negative than a positive. That is remarkable when you think about it.

Therefore, in regard to our 2018/19 campaign I am solely going to focus on the positives:

- Twenty-one players donned the baggy in A Grade this season. More players experiencing Barclay Shield cricket can only make us stronger in the long-term.
- We had six debutants (Nathan Chrimes, Xavier Youngman, Brett Money, Sam Edward, Dempsey Mills and David Rowley).
- Getting more games into the likes of Luke Morgan, Brett Lewis, Liam Johns, Ben Money, Marcus Brooker and Bradley Gedge - blokes that have been knocking on the door the past couple of seasons but have struggled to get a look in. Again, this will make us stronger in the long-term.
- Pushing Diamond Creek all the way in round five who were undefeated at the end of the regular season.
- Easily accounting for Epping (who finished second) in the final round.
- Defeating eventual premiers Macleod in round three and pushing them all the way in round ten.

As you can see there are plenty of positives to take away. Our best was good enough to compete with and defeat the best but we just weren't consistent enough.

- Sam Edward getting his debut at 12:57pm on game day and playing a role in the match.
- Dempsey Mills and David Rowley (two debutants) putting on 27 runs for the last wicket against Macleod.
- David Rowley taking 3/15 on debut against Macleod at the ripe young age of 37 and dismissing one of, if not the competition's most dangerous batsmen in Richard Johnson.
- Watching Scott Gibbs and Elliot Smale play a major role in their final A Grade game. Gibbo took 1 wicket and made 34, while EJ took four catches and made 20. Thus, bringing an end to a combined total of 396 Barclay Shield games!

On that note I would like to make special mention of Scott, Elliot and Tim Knox who have all retired from A Grade for varying reasons. Knocka you have given two great years of service at RCC and played a vital role with the ball and bat (at various stages). You were an integral member of the premiership side and played an important role as bowling coach this season. The knowledge and wisdom you have been able to impart on the young bowling

brigade is priceless and the club is only going to benefit from your services in the coming years. Even though you have only been here for a short time it feels like you have been here for a long time. I might be a bit biased but there is also no doubt in my mind that this is the best run club in the DVCA and that is attributed to all your hard work.

Finally, to my beautiful wife Katie. Thank you for your unconditional support throughout the season. I know at times it has not been easy on you with my extra commitments and sometimes grumpiness on Saturday nights, but we got there. Not only do players make commitments and sacrifices throughout the season but so too do their loved ones. For that I sincerely thank you.

In closing, we may not have performed as well as we would have liked this year but I still feel that we made progress. Anytime you can get more A grade games into players and have six A grade debutants, the better you will be. Trust me the payoff will come. It's like the old adage "one step back to take two steps forward". We may have taken a step back this year in terms of ladder position but we are moving forward and I can see us taking great strides forward next season.

## **2<sup>nd</sup> XI (DVCA B Grade)**

Losing a final is tough to swallow, losing a final by 2 wickets certainly doesn't make it easier, and that feeling of disappointment myself and the other 10 guys felt on that Sunday I hope will burn away at each and every player all winter and into the pre-season. However, that game may have summed up our performances this season, we had the ability to take it right up to the team that would be the eventual premier and had their measure at times, however we were never able to put together a complete performance this season.

Despite the disappointment post game, I still had overwhelming amount of pride in not only the fight we displayed to pull ourselves back into the game, but the improvement that a number of players made this season that ultimately contributed to us once again competing in another B Grade finals series.

Being a big stats guy I had a good look at some personnel numbers from this season.

- 27 guys played B Grade this season, 7 of the 11 2017/18 premiership players playing at least 1 game in B Grade
- 10 Debutants in B grade: Xavier Youngman, Joel Ramsay, Tom Hewett, Jacob Bowden, Sam Edward, David Rowley, Ryan Gleeson, Aidan Amenta, Nik Martin & Cameron Drake
- 46 changes made this season, at an average of 3.5 per game
- We had 9 players play 10+ games in 2017/18, this season we had 2
- We were number 1 in the competition for runs scored by some margin, we were 7th however in wickets taken, taken all 10 wickets in only 2 matches

These stats show that whilst there were a lot of changes, and a lot of new faces, this meant there was huge amount of opportunity in B Grade this year, every single player who represented the club will be able to take something into next season that will make them a better cricketer, and that if you want to play as high a level as you can, then continue to put in the work that will get you the results.

Both Macleod victories I feel were our best and perhaps most important team victories in the end, considering we snuck into the finals on percentage. With one of the youngest B Grade Teams I've seen us name, we were behind all game but fought the game out to the last ball, with 3 wickets in hand and 4 off the last over required by Macleod, Rolls took 2 wickets and only went for 2 runs to get us to victory, bowling the number 8 on the final ball for the win. Our 2nd win showed the toughness of Glenn Smyth, to bat essentially 70 overs to chase down 200 8 down, assisted by Matt Doyle to get us out of some early trouble, and late hitting by Joel Ramsay, keeping us in the hunt for a finals spot with a game to go.

Some individual players I wish to acknowledge:

- The development of Marcus Brooker (166 Runs & 5 Wickets) and Ben Money (202 Runs & 4 Wickets), both who have fantastic ability with the bat that pushed them into A Grade, but being able to take their skills with the ball further this season, showing the importance that players continue to work on all facets of their game!
- Sam Edward coming into the club and showing his ability with the bat, winning the batting average (220 Runs @ 73.33) and showing he has what it takes to be a Riverside A Grader for the next 10 years and beyond.
- Our young bowlers in Joel Ramsay and Jacob Bowden, who pushed their way up the grades with big pre-seasons, not only making their B Grade debuts but showing they belong at that level, keep learning and honing your skills boys!
- Ben Jurkovic & Ryan Gleeson, young batsman who were given an opportunity with a lot of changes to develop their batting in the top order, both who will have learnt a lot from the experience and have bright futures in the higher grades.
- Dempsey Mills (Best Under 21 Award) for continuing to improve as another all rounder in our side that led to a well deserved A Grade Debut.
- Tom Hewett who took the gloves in the absence of Liam Johns and improved with every game with his keeping, mightily impressive for a player in his final year as an under 16 who did not look out of place.
- Mat Doyle (268 Runs @ 44.67) & Glenn Smyth (143 Runs @ 71.50) who brought that experience in the middle order that helped push our younger guys to keep making runs and compete for positions

- Josh Money, Cameron Drake and Dale Juchnevicius who all through continued improvement and good performances in D Grade pushed their way into the B Grade side late in the year and into the finals series

One person I wish to particularly acknowledge is David Rowley (23 Wickets @ 12.57), and there is no secret as to why Rolls performed the way he did, Rolls was there most pre-season nights at Cutting Edge, running laps of Bundoora before anyone had arrived, he attended the majority of sessions, bowling all night to get his body in match condition, giving himself every opportunity to be the best cricketer he can, There is no doubt a memory I will cherish is telling the DILF that he would make his B Grade and subsequently A Grade debuts. Age is purely a number, those who put in the work will get the results they deserve and to cap it off with a club and competition B Grade Bowling award is just another feather in your cap Rolls, I hope not only you, but every player who pulls on the baggy green and gold works as hard as you to achieve our goals next season. I had to ask Rolls at times to dig deep and bowl that extra spell or couple of overs, it never phased him as he did what he needed for the team and always stuck to the plan, pitching the ball up and giving it a chance to swing, the last ball at Macleod to take us to victory was a testament to this (and very clutch!). Rolls and Josh Money's opening spell in the semi final to have the Diamond Creek top order 5/31 was the very definition of bowling to a plan and the field.

## Under 16 - Teal

The U16's started the season with only 10 players and played the first 2 games with only 9. Round 6 was a wash out week one and a heat out week 2 against Banyule /Lower Plenty and round 7 a wash out against Diamond Creek. We returned after the Xmas break with round 8, batting first we made 9/229 (B. Neave 62, T. Hewett 45) defeating Research Eltham Collegians 120 (J. Rae 2/0, J. McDonnell 2/3). Round 9 saw us batting first, 8/164 (B. Neave 50, T. Hewett 37, J. Rae 21) defeating Plenty 58 (J. Rae 2/1, Luke Jurkovic 2/3, Connor Melville 2/14) to see out the home and away season. The fielding standard of the boys throughout the season was brilliant, throwing their bodies around and creating a lot of scoring pressure on the opposition.

The semi final saw us up against Banyule/Lower Plenty who we didn't play in the home/away season due to the washout/ heat out inn round 6. Week 1 was washed out so we played a one day game week 2. They won the toss and batted first, we struggled with the ball losing one of our bowlers in Josh Rae in the first over after bowling 2 waist high full tosses. They batted well and finished their 20 overs making 3/142 with Luke Jurkovic the pick of the bowlers taking 2/30. ## Under 14 Blue

We did lose a couple of very close games that in both cases went down to the final over that we could, perhaps should, have won; but – we finished with some great team cricket in our last rounds in which EVERYONE (not just our award winners and honourable mentions) contributed.

I'd like to congratulate the boys on the cricket they played and the spirit they played it in. I'd like to acknowledge the great job our two captains – Jack Atkinson and Tom Robinson – did throughout the season. I tried to limit my in-game / on-field coaching and let them run the show, including calling on them to contribute to / lead team talks, and they did a great job, learning on the job and growing as leaders over the season. But ALL the boys did themselves proud. They played really well as a team and as stated we finished the season with some really good all-round team performances. It was great to see them get around and support each other, and also share in each-others' highlights.

The Batting Award for the 2018-19 season went to Jack Atkinson who hit 228 runs at an average of 114 (including 6 not outs), with a match-winning highest score of 85. Honourable mentions went to Aaron Rae who finished the season with 144 runs at an average of 24 with a top score of 44\*, and Tom Robinson with 142 at 35 with a top score of 51\*.

The Bowling Award went to Noah Gleeson who was probably our most consistently accurate and economical bowler all season. Noah took 8 wickets for the season at 9.88 with best figures of 3 for 5 (including a hat-trick). Jack Atkinson and Miles Coates – our opening bowlers – were our next best bowlers with 6 wickets each. Unfortunately for this pair the opposition openers struggled to even get edge of bat to ball all year.

Jack, Aaron, Noah and Miles all made their senior cricket debuts for Riverside in 2018-2019 also and all looked they belonged at the next level. Tom and Miles also represented the DVCA in the Russell Allen U14 Shield; and Jack Atkinson represented the 'Falcons' in the Youth Premier League, and was then selected for / represented 'Renegades Metro' in the Youth Super Series. Congratulations boys!

As always, we had the best part of a team of contenders and deserving winners of the Coach's Award for their attitude / work ethic / team spirit and sportsmanship etc. week in and out. This went to Elliott Campbell this year and is a bit of an all-rounder award in his case. He received the award for all of the above reasons, but also for how 'coachable' he was – consistently seeking out and acting on coaching input each week, and growing as a player over the season which we saw in his on-field performances. Also, to acknowledge those performances – his 'work-horse' contributions with bat and ball which didn't earn him awards but were vital for our team. Cricket is "a game of partnerships" and Elliott was the silent partner in several key partnerships, holding up his end and helping bat us out of tight situations (batting wherever he was asked without complaint), and get into competitive positions. We knew what we were in for from both a cricketing and an enjoyment perspective after their first win in Round 1 against Greensborough, which saw the boys head off on a lap of the ground, soaring like aeroplanes, much to the amusement/chagrin of myself and Under 12 Manager Toby, who issued a few stern words to the boys about not doing it again. Their celebrations post the grand final win were big, but were very much respectful of the opposition, a sign that they had developed both as cricketers and as individuals and a team throughout the season.

I believe we have a very strong core playing group moving forward up the junior ranks, if these boys continue to develop and enjoy their cricket, and continue to love playing for the mighty Siders. I worry for the other clubs who play us, as the level of cricket and development from the boys progressed rapidly throughout the season, both at training



and in games. We had a great mix of bowling, fielding and batting talent, and every boy contributed every week in some or all elements of the game, right through to the last wicket of the grand final. To that end, all of the boys bowled in each game, and all bowled approximately 20 overs each for the season. They all opened with the new ball at some point, and batted in nearly every spot in the batting order, with a 30 ball maximum innings generally used to ensure most/all of the boys got a hit. Their voice, support and energy in the field was also a highlight.

The boys really clicked into gear in the finals. In the semi-final v Research, we batted our 20 overs and made 79, and then bowled and fielded brilliantly (including 4 run outs) to knock them over for 59. In the Grand Final, we made 182 from our 40 overs, with a number of batsman making their highest scores, and almost half of the team batting their allocated 30 balls. Our bowling and fielding effort started with wides, no balls and boundaries galore as Diamond Creek reached 4 for 113 at the innings break. However, the boys weren't going to let the opportunity slip, and came out and bowled and fielded brilliantly, with Maggie Chasteau rattling the stumps to bowl them out for 128 and sparking joyous celebrations for the boys and their families.

To the awards – with both the batting and bowling averages only decided following the Grand Final, such was the even contribution from all 12 boys.

The batting average was very close, with a number of the boys with high run totals and averages, but the winner for this season is Max Henderson with 119 runs at 29.75, with a highest score of 40 not out. Max is a very positive batsman with a very sound technique, who always scored quickly, and hits the ball hard for a kid his age.

Same for the bowling, it was very even, with wickets well spread across all 12 boys. The winner for this season is Samuel Hartigan, with 6 wickets at 8.67. Sam takes after his old man a bit, and just bowls a good line and length at a good pace, which is all you can ask for at this age. He's even learning to swing the ball a bit.

To the Coaches Award – always the hardest one to give in my book. I based my decision on this boy's level of enjoyment, progression and improvement in all aspects of the game over the course of the season, his bright and cheery personality on and off the field, and the fact he is just a good kid and he's going to be a very good cricketer as he grows and develops. My Coaches Award for this season goes to 'Puppy Bear' – Isaac Thompson. Two things about Isaac – 1) the smile and joy on his face when he made his top score, including hitting his first boundary late in the season was priceless, as was his disappointment in the last game when he just fell short of beating it again. 2) He may be tiny, but he's a tough little bugger. In one game at North Eltham he copped a full-blooded pull shot in the arm whilst fielding. He could have flinched or jumped out the way, but he stood behind the ball, did his best to catch it, and despite copping it flush on the arm, he bounced up, chased the ball down and threw it back to the keeper. One of my favourite moments from the season ☺

Finally, a big thankyou to the boys for your efforts and enjoyment this season, both at training and in games, generally training and playing in very hot conditions after a long, hot day at school. The challenge at this age is always to find a balance between enjoyment and development, and most of the time we did that, even if they were a handful from time to time, a la the aeroplanes in Round 1. A massive thanks to all of the parents who assisted where possible with scoring, ground setup, BBQ cooking, packing up etc.

A huge thanks to Kristy Doyle for her role as Team Manager, keeping everyone informed and organised and setting up the scoring roster. And sincere thanks to Toby, the Under 12s Co-ordinator for his assistance, support and advice this season as always. He plays a bit of the Bad Cop to my Good Cop from time to time, but he is a great asset for this club and for the 12 boys in the team, so thankyou Toba!!

Thankyou everyone, and we look forward to seeing the boys back in the green and gold next season.

## **ELLIOT SMALE CALLS TIME**

It is the end of an era with one of our most decorated players, Elliot Smale, calling time on his A-Grade career. Elliot has been a fixture of the A-Grade team since making his debut in 1993/94 (Cap #159), over 25 years ago. Elliot has since gone on to play the most A-Grade games (247) and make the most A-Grade runs (6509 at an average of 29.6) in our club's rich history. Elliot's underrated bowling should also be mentioned as he has collected 118 wickets whilst also being the wicket keeper for many seasons – 118 wickets as a wicket keeper is not a bad effort!

Other notable achievements over Elliot's time in A Grade have been winning the Ray Christensen Medal as the best player in the competition in 2011/12, 3 Jim Fitzpatrick Medals as the best player in A Grade for Riverside (2002/03, 2011/12, 2012/13), 2 President's Trophies as the best performed player in the club, and a record 8 A-Grade batting averages (2000/01, 2001/02, 2002/03, 2005/06, 2006/07, 2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13).

Elliot has filled many roles in that time, including two years as A-Grade captain (2013-2015) and 14 years on the committee including 6 as vice-president.

More than all the numbers, Elliot is a fantastic Riverside person as evidenced by all the work he continues to do at the club with the Junior Blasters & Master Blasters. We are extremely lucky to have someone like Elliot at Riverside and whilst his A-Grade days may be over, he will continue to pull on the green & gold baggy for a few years to come yet.

We invite all our past players, members, supporters and anyone else that would like to come along, to please join us at the club next Saturday (2nd March) as we celebrate the end of Elliot's fantastic A-Grade career. We would like to have as many of you there to cheer Elliot off the field one final time.

## **GIBBO PULLS UP STUMPS**

We were informed just before the beginning of play on Saturday that another one of our greatest ever players in Scott Gibbs was also playing his last A Grade game (following on from Elliot Smale's retirement last week). Scott began at Riverside in season 2003/04 (Cap #197) as our Captain/Coach having played at Northcote and having originally played for Diamond Creek. He would go on to carve out one of the best (if not the best) Riverside careers of all time.

Scott's record speaks for itself across his 148 A Grade games; 4,542 A Grade runs (5th most all-time) at an average of 33.9 with 9 hundreds (1st all-time) and 19 fifties with a highest score of 138. 295 wickets (2nd all-time) at an average of 16.3 with a best of 7/27 among his sixteen 5 -wicket hauls (1st all-time).

In that time Scott won 7 Jim Fitzpatrick medals (best A Grade player at Riverside) in a row in his first seven seasons (2003/04-2009/10) and was awarded the Ray Christensen Medal (best player in Barclay Shield) in his first season in 2003/04. He took home the President's Trophy (awarded on points amongst the entire senior playing group) on six occasions, won the A Grade batting award 3 times and the A Grade bowling award 5 times. Scott is also the longest serving A Grade captain in our history (92 games with a 61% winning ratio) ahead of club legend Kevin Fitzpatrick (74 games).

No doubt Scott's career highlight though was being a part of the winning Barclay Shield premiership team in season 2017/18 and being in the middle with Chris Salm when the winning runs were scored. Scott certainly celebrated long and hard and did not take his medal off for weeks (and may still be wearing it).

We are lucky to have had Scott as a part of Riverside over the past 16 years. He is someone everyone loves having a chat & a Coke Zero with and someone you can rely on for a good laugh. The good news is Scott is going to continue to play at the club and be a part of the playing group in the lower grades going forward which we can't wait for.
